



Important Information

The Rocky Mountain, Pacific and Northern Plains Districts of USA Hockey are pleased to announce its 2026 Western Regional High-Performance Boys Camp for 2012 birth-year players. While furthering their development, our expectation is for all players to bring a high compete level and desire to learn. As a reminder, all participants must be US Citizens and registered with USA Hockey for the current season.

Location and Dates

The Camp will be held at Colorado College in Colorado Springs. The camp will use Robson Arena on campus. All players will check-in on Monday June 8, 2026, and camp will end on Saturday June 13, 2026, at 12:00pm. Players that are flying to the camp should arrive at either Denver or Colorado Springs Airports no later than 2:30pm. Departure flights on Saturday June 14th should not be scheduled earlier than 4:00pm. If you cannot meet these requirements, you should contact one of the camp directors immediately. Arrangements will be made to transport players from the airport to Colorado College Campus and the return to the airport on Saturday June 14th. If you are bringing your son to the camp, check-in begins at 3:00pm and ends at 5:00pm.

Important

If you choose to fly your player to camp, any players that fly as an **Unaccompanied Minor** must make their own arrangements to have an adult pick-up and drop-off player at the airport and accompany them to/from the gate. WRHPC will not be providing staff for those players who fly with Unaccompanied Minor status. Please check with your airline to find out their rules.

Camp Fees

The cost for the Camp is \$950 per player. The fee includes housing, meals, ice time, seminars, jersey, socks and ground transportation to and from the airport. Although not necessary, players are encouraged to have a small amount of spending money for extra drinks and snacks.

Can Parents Attend

Yes, parents can attend. All ice sessions and seminars are open to the parents. If parents attend, they are responsible for their own housing, meals and transportation. The dorms are not available to the parents. Parents will have **very limited** access to their sons during the camp as all participants will be under the care of USA Hockey in a team environment. Players will be very busy. Parents may be able to visit with their son just before and after the on-ice sessions.

Camp Format

The camp will be very similar to a USA Hockey National Camp. The players will be placed on teams upon arrival. There will be two ice sessions each day with one ice session on the final day and additional off-ice sessions and seminars throughout the week. The emphasis of the camp will be on player development and education.

Check-in Process

Check-in begins at 3:00pm at South Hall on the Colorado College Campus. You may park in the parking lot next to South Hall entrance during drop-off. The registration area is well marked. Players must have all of their forms (found at the registration website) completed online before check-in.

At check-in, players will be introduced to their coaches and team leaders and receive camp materials including jersey, socks, and key to room. Due to space constraints, parents will not be allowed into the check-in area. Parents will be allowed to visit the dorm areas including the rooms during the check-in window. Parents must clear the dorm area inside of the secured doors by 5:00pm of check-in day. After that point, access by parents to any area inside the secured doors is strictly prohibited.

Once the player is checked into camp, he is not permitted to leave camp (even for local residents) until the end of camp or officially checked out of camp early. All players are required to stay on campus during the camp.

Items to Bring to Camp

1. Required USA Hockey equipment including mouthguard and neck laceration protector.
2. Extra hockey sticks.
3. Spare blade steel if you have them. Skate sharpening will be available for \$10.
4. Dry land gear including running shoes. Each player will receive a water bottle.
5. Clothes for the duration of camp. We suggest shorts and comfortable shirts.
6. Toiletries and a towel to use at the rink. Bedding and towels will be provided to you for use in dorm.

Selection of Teammates & Roommates

Teammates and roommates **may not** be requested. The camp directors arrange teams based on a variety of factors including geographic diversity. The goal of the camp is to introduce players to new experiences and to create conditions that mimic the process and structure of future National Selection Camps.

Summary

We look forward to providing a great opportunity for the elite level male players in the Rocky Mountain, Pacific and Northern Plains Districts of USA Hockey. Our expectations are high for both on and off-ice competition and the opportunity for our players to showcase their talent and competitive attitude. We expect a professional and safe atmosphere for our players and staff as this opportunity is for serious athletes who wish to take their game to a higher level.
